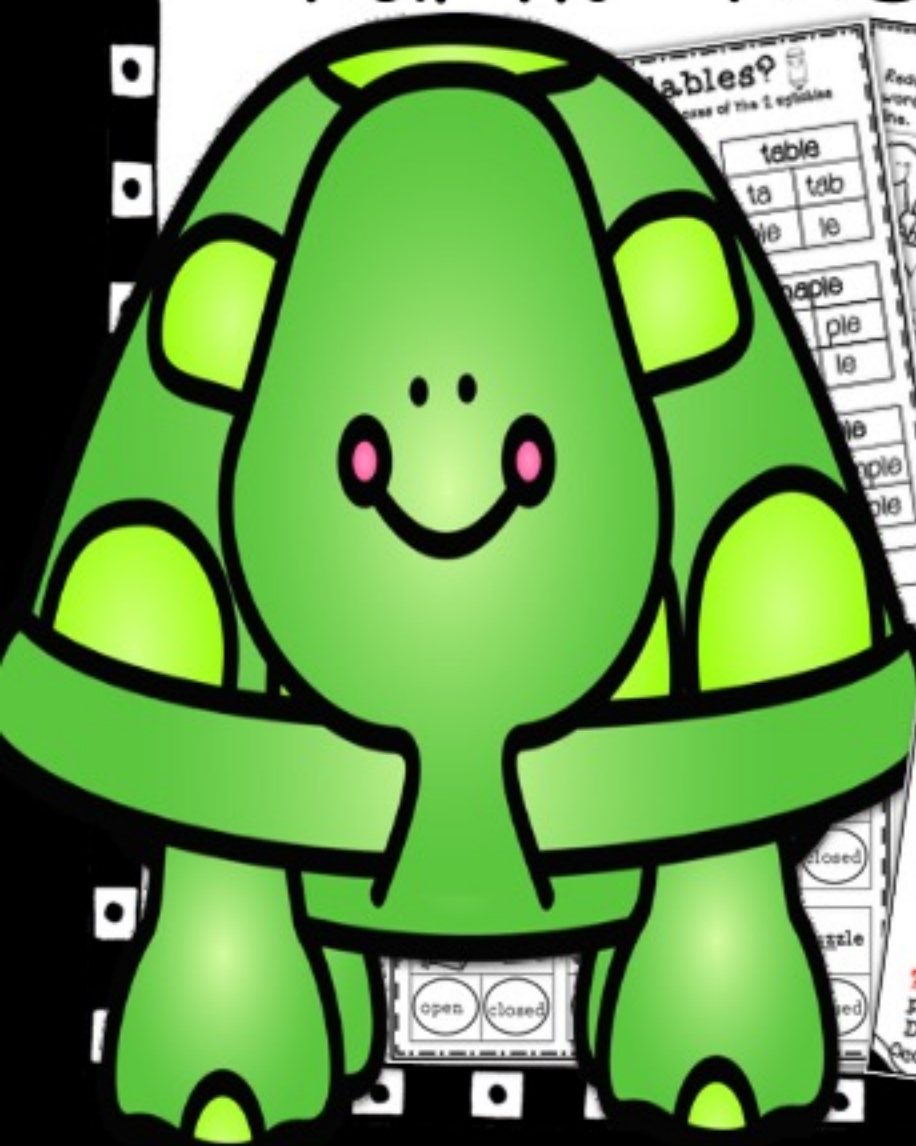

Syllable c+le

When a word **ends in le**, preceded by a **consonant**, the syllable is divided before that consonant.

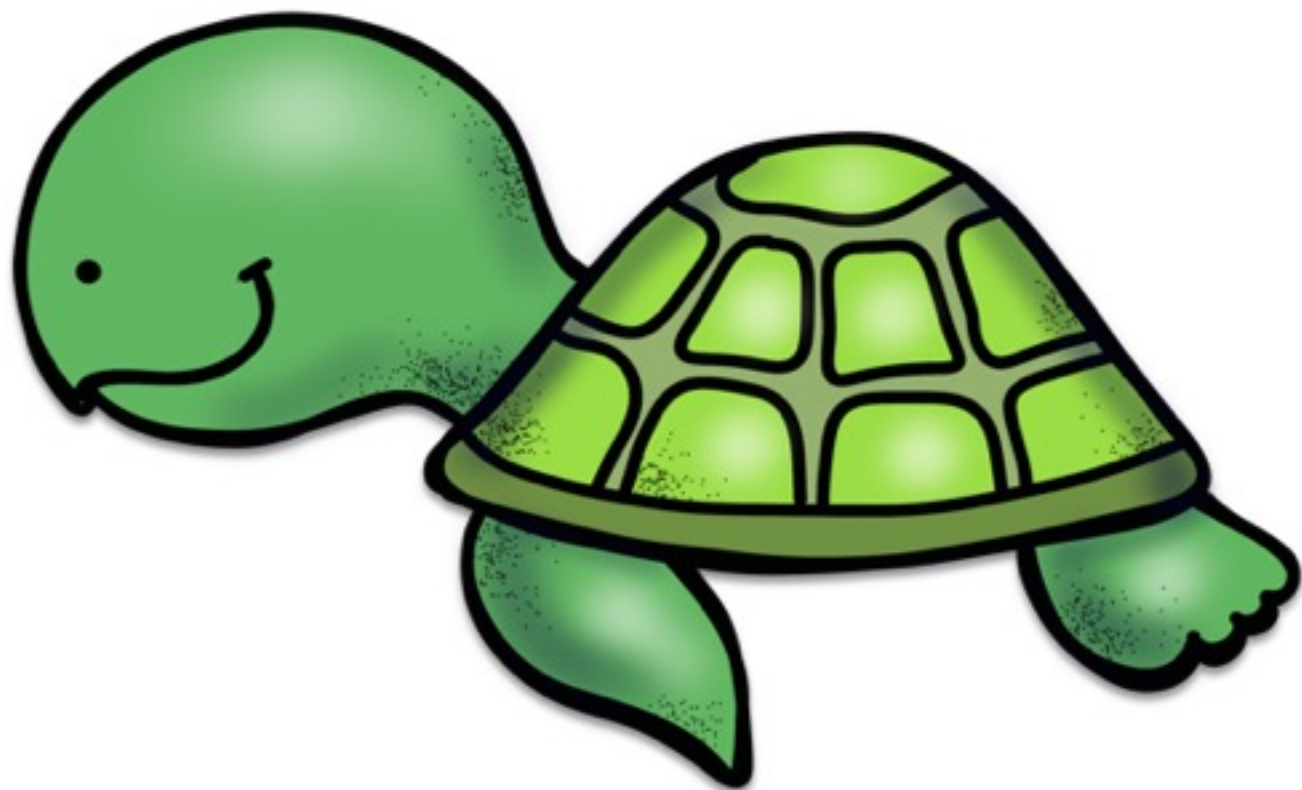


tur/tle

Turtle ends in le and is preceded by the consonant t. Divide the word before the consonant t.

When a word **ends in le**, **preceded by a consonant**, the syllable is divided before that consonant.



tur/tle

Turtle ends in le and is preceded by the consonant t. Divide the word before the consonant t.

c + le Syllable Pattern

Open Syllable

If the syllable ends in a vowel, the syllable is "open" and the vowel is a long sound.

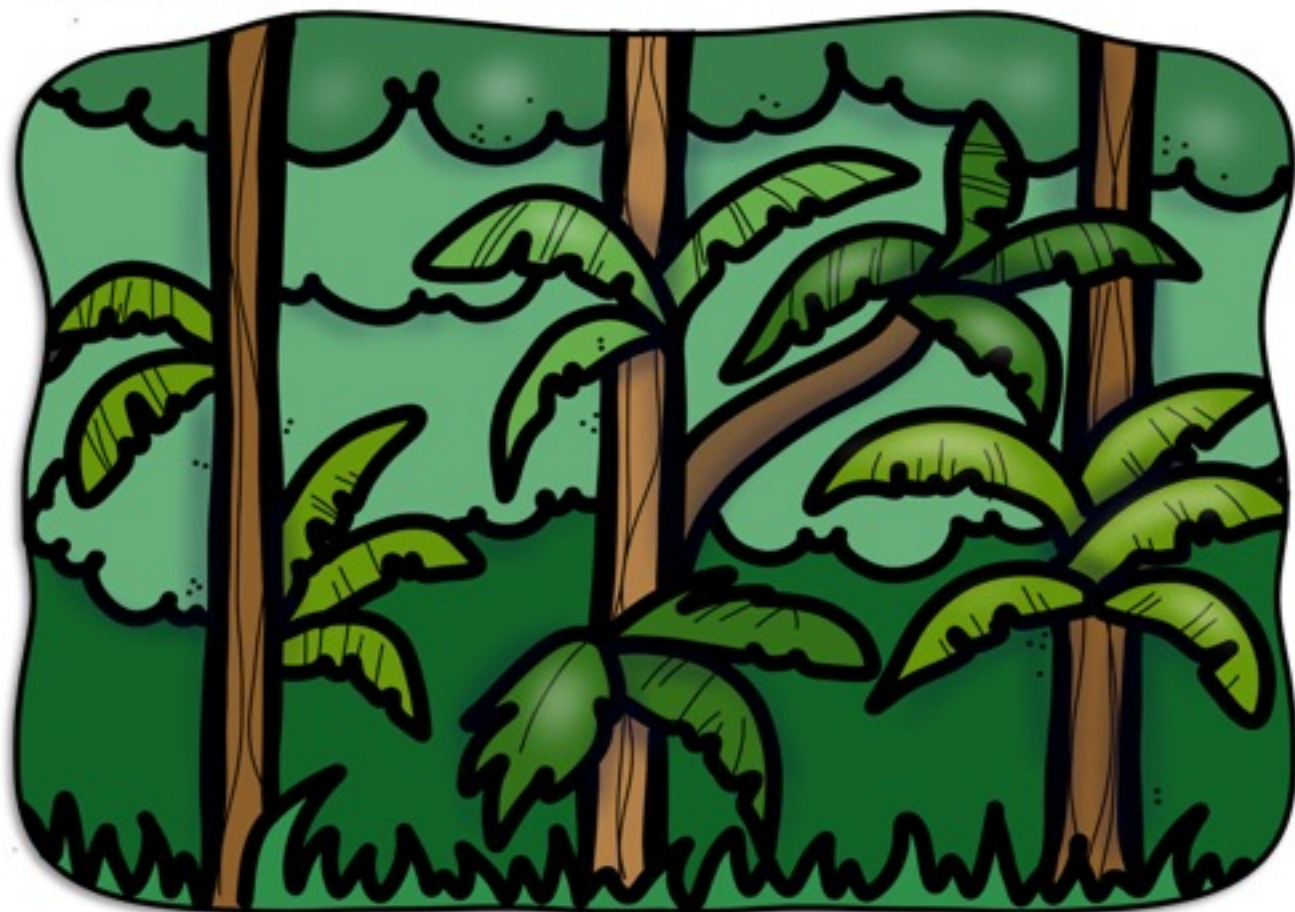


bridle

c + le Syllable Pattern

Closed Syllable

If the **syllable ends in a consonant**, the syllable is **"closed"** and the vowel is a short sound.



jun**u** | g1e

c + le - Syllable Pattern

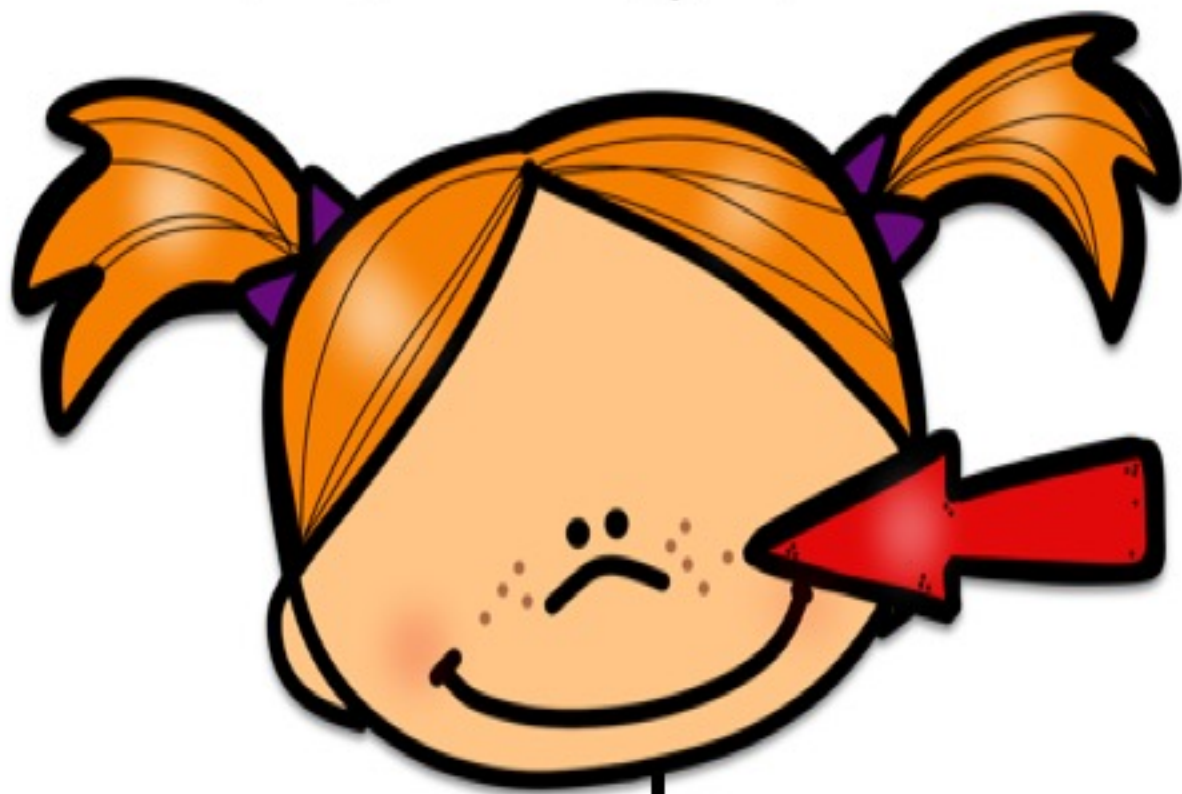
If the syllable ends in a vowel and is a short sound we **double up letters** after a short vowel sound. We **double up** the end consonant when we add suffix endings to keep the vowel short.



gig | gle

Exception to the c+le syllable pattern

If the word has a **ck** before the **le** the **ck** can not be split, and le becomes its own syllable.



freckle

The word freckle has a **ck** in it. Separate the word before the le. Do not separate the ck.

Syllable – Word Ending -le



When a word ends in **le**, preceded by a consonant, the syllable is divided before that consonant.
