Did You Know?

All Saints' Day is also known as All Hallows' Day and is the day after All Hallows' Eve (Halloween).

What Is a Saint?

A saint is someone who has proven himself or herself to be holy by following God's teachings and has entered the kingdom of heaven.

How Does Someone Become a Saint?

The Catholic church believes that anyone can become a saint but there must be proof that the person has performed two miracles. These miracles can happen during or after their life. If a person performs one miracle, they can be blessed.

What Is a Miracle?

A miracle is something that cannot be explained by science or nature. For example, Saint Francis of Assisi was able to talk to animals and heal them with a touch.

All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day

Pope Boniface IV created All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day in 609AD. All Souls' Day is celebrated the day after All Saints' Day, the 2nd November. All Saints' Day is a day of obligation; All Souls' Day is not.





What Is a Day of Obligation?

A day of obligation means that Catholics must attend Mass. Sunday is a day of obligation and there are several holy days throughout the year. As well as attending Mass, it is important to try and do something special and avoid doing any unnecessary chores such as cleaning.

Patron Saints

A patron saint is a holy person who looks after different areas of life. There are patron saints for all sorts of things, such as jobs, animals and even learning. Nations can have patron saints too. They are said to protect their country in times of trouble.
