Numeracy and Mathematics - 3D Objects



Starter:

Main Challenge:

Do the objects roll? Do the objects stack?
Can you sort them? (Example - Object
rolls/Object does not roll)

Numeracy and Mathematics -Sequencing/ordering numbers



Main Challenge:

Sequence sets of numbers from 0-100 (Page 8)

- 1. Write each number on a separate piece of paper (example 38,39,40,41)
- 2. Mix up the piece of paper
- 3. Put the numbers in the correct order
- 4. Repeat with another set of numbers

Extra Challenge:

Order numbers which are not in **sequence** (example - 3,71,55,12)

Health and Wellbeing - Smiles

- 1. Draw a smile on lots of bits of paper.
- 2. Hide the smiles in around your home.
- 3. When someone finds a smile **tell** them something that makes you smile.
- 4. Ask them what makes them smile.

Numeracy and Mathematics - Recognising Numbers

Say the numbers (For example: 23 and 56).

Compare the two numbers

Which is larger? Which is smaller?

Repeat with new numbers

Extra Challenge:

Which is the largest/ smallest number?

Extra Challenge:

Complete the dot-to-dot puzzle backwards (starting from the biggest number)

Numeracy and Mathematics - Code Pu

- 1. Write one number for each letter of the English alphabet (e.g. A=1, B=2, ...)
- 2. Write your first name in code (e.g. Olek would be 15/12/5/11)

Extra challenge:

Write a coded message for someone Code using a different alphabet, if you know one (e.g. Arabic, Greek)

Science - Weather



- 1. Fold a piece of paper in half.
- 2. Fold the paper in **half** again. The paper is now in 4 **quarters**.
- 3. Draw a different kind of weather on each quarter. (e.g. sun, rain, snow, wind)
- 4. Cut/tear the paper into the 4 quarters.


Extra Challenge:




Spelling task resource


